

I will never forget my first big bungee jump. I had done some bungee jumping indoors, but I'd never tried it outdoors. I'd also watched people on TV jump off big cliffs, waterfalls and bridges but I thought it was too scary for me.¹ So we went to Middlesbrough, which has a famous bridge, for my first big bungee jump. The bridge, which crosses the river Tees, was opened in 1911 and is made of iron. I had to climb 122 steps to get to the top.² A jump officer helped me put on my kit and then it was my turn to jump. Suddenly I was very scared. I wasn't able to breathe; I couldn't move.³ It was awesome. I jumped 50 metres down to the water. I could see my mum and dad waving from the river bank as I was falling. I felt great!
