Numbers are made up of digits. Each digit in a number has a different place value.

Three digits make a period. A 1, 2, or 3 digit number is in the ones period and does not have a comma or space. For example: 6; 27; 482

A 4, 5 or 6 digit number is in the thousands period, so it has one comma or space. For example: 2 381; 86 492; 268 674

A 7, 8, or 9 digit number is in the millions period, so it has two commas or spaces. For example: 4 785 306; 27 265 917; 358 704 197
