Specific ability: when you can or can't do something in a particular situation. When we talk about achieving something on a particular occasion in the past or in the future.

We lost our compass but we were able (managed to) find the road in the end.

In negative sentences we can use both **could** and **be able to** to say that we were not capable of doing something on a specific occasion.

It was very dark and we couldn't (weren't able to) find the right path.
