Hardly know what she did, she picked up a little bit of stick, and held it out to the puppy and threw the stick as far as she could; whereupon the puppy jumped into the air off all its feet at once, with a yelp of delight, and rushed at the stick. Alice then dodged behind a great thistle, to keep herself from being run over. The puppy made another rush at the stick, and tumbled head over heels in its hurry to get hold of it. Alice, thinking was very like having a game of play with a cart-horse, and expecting every moment to be trampled under its feet, ran round the thistle again. How I Choose the Course to Pursue in University

This is the last year I would be in secondary school. **27** There are so many things to think about and this could be quite overwhelming for some students. However, I am also open to making any changes to it as I know that what I pursue later will greatly depend on my examination results for sure.

When choosing a subject area to pursue, I believe that we should first of all think about what we will enjoy studying. **28** Another reason why we should love what we are studying is because we will be spending at least the next few years of our life studying that particular field. I do not think that anyone would want to spend their precious time doing something that they do not like. However, it also needs to be pointed out that it is quite normal for some students to switch courses in university later. So, do not be too worried about the choices that you make.

29 Thinking about what career you want to have in the future and the prospect of getting a job later will help direct you in making your decision of the course to take. Nevertheless, I have to say that this is not easy to do. **30** So, this is the time I believe that we could have a chat with our parents, uncles or aunts and other people like your school counsellor and teachers to get some ideas.

Then of course there is the entry requirement for you to be accepted for a course in university. **31** This will normally specify the subjects that you are studying in secondary school and the grades that you should achieve to get into the course. So, when choosing a course, look at the grades requirement and then compare them to your predicted grades that you might get in your examinations. If for instance the course requirement is much higher than your predicted grades, then it is best to look at a different university that requires a lower grade. **32**
