A \_\_\_\_\_

\_\_\_\_\_ stands on its own. It has no other house next to it.



\_\_\_\_\_ are two houses joined together by a common wall.



A \_\_\_\_\_

\_\_\_\_\_ is a house situated in a long row of houses. They usually look the same. Both sides of each house shares a common wall with the neighbouring house.



A \_\_\_\_\_

\_\_\_\_\_ is a large building divided into flats where all the flats share a front door.



A \_\_\_\_\_ is

built on one level (= one floor). It doesn't have any stairs.



A \_\_\_\_\_ is a

house, usually in the countryside. This kind of houses usually have one and a half storey: the top floor is much smaller than the ground floor.



A \_\_\_\_\_ is a

big luxurious house with a secure big central garden and often with a swimming-pool.



A \_\_\_\_\_ is a

very large detached house.



A \_\_\_\_\_ apartment

is an apartment that combines living room, bedroom and kitchenette into a single room, but not the bathroom.
