Grammar: Subject and Predicate
A sentence has <b>two</b> parts: a <b>subject</b> (naming part) and a <b>predicate</b> (telling part). The <b>subject</b> tells who or what the sentence is about. The <b>predicate</b> tells more about the subject (naming part). It tells what someone or something is doing or did.
Example: Mrs. McPhee drove her car to school.  Mrs. McPhee is the subject. She is who the sentence is about. Drove her car to school is the predicate because it tells what she did.
