

Present Simple

TO BE

- (+) S + am/is/are + predicate
- (-) S + am/is/are + not + predicate
- (?) Am/is/are + S + predicate + ?

VERBS

- (+) S + verb + object
- (-) S + don't/doesn't + verb + object
- (?) Do/ Does + S + verb + object + ?

EXAMPLE

TO BE

- (+) I am Chinese
- (+) He only eats chicken
- (-) She is not a boy
- (-) We are not together
- (?) Am I bothering you?
- (?) Are you good?

VERBS

- (+) I study English at school
- (+) He loves dance
- (-) She does not play with dolls
- (-) We do not like math class
- (?) Do you like to fish?
- (?) Does she run every morning?



AD

When we talk about situations, the present simple is usually used together with adverbs of time:

- Always
- Everyday
- Ever
- Sometimes
- Often
- Usually
