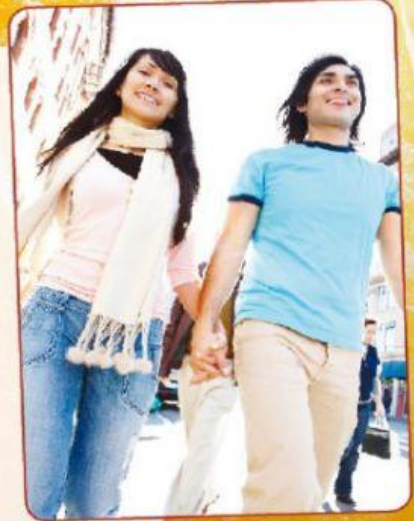

'Oh, Bob! This is a wax model, not a real person!'

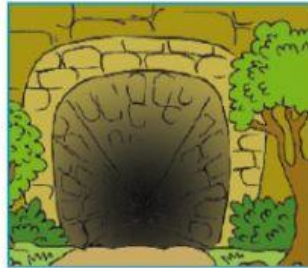
