



Listening Strategy: Sequence

In some listening passages, the order of events might be important. You may have to determine the sequence of time. When you listen, pay attention to sequence words. A sequence word is any word that indicates the time or order something happened. Sequence words can help you more easily understand the order of events. This type of question is most common in Parts 3 and 4 of the test.

Some Common Sequence Words:

| Event happened before | Event happened at almost the same time | Event happened after |
|-----------------------|--|----------------------|
| before | when | after |
| until | while | then |
| already | during | following |
| first | as | next |

Helpful Hints:

Sequence words can have different positions in a sentence. The clause right after the sequence word is usually the important one.

Ex I have to feed my cat¹ before I go out². = Before I **go out**², I have to **feed my cat**¹.

What will happen *first*? I feed my cat.

What will happen *next*? I go out.

Ex Listen to the conversation and choose the best answer.

M: Oh no! The architect canceled our meeting today.

W: What about the plans for the new office design?

M: I don't know. I have a meeting with the boss about that.

W: Before you meet with him, you need to
talk to the architect.

M: Right, I'd better phone the architect.

- What should happen *first*? Talk to the architect
- What should happen *next*? Meet with their boss

What does the man have to do first?

Sequence word in question → indicates what event is important to look for

(A) Meet with his boss
(B) Plan the office
(C) Cancel a meeting
(D) Talk with the architect

→ meeting must happen *after*
→ no mention of *who* is making the plans
→ the *architect* canceled
→ **correct answer**
