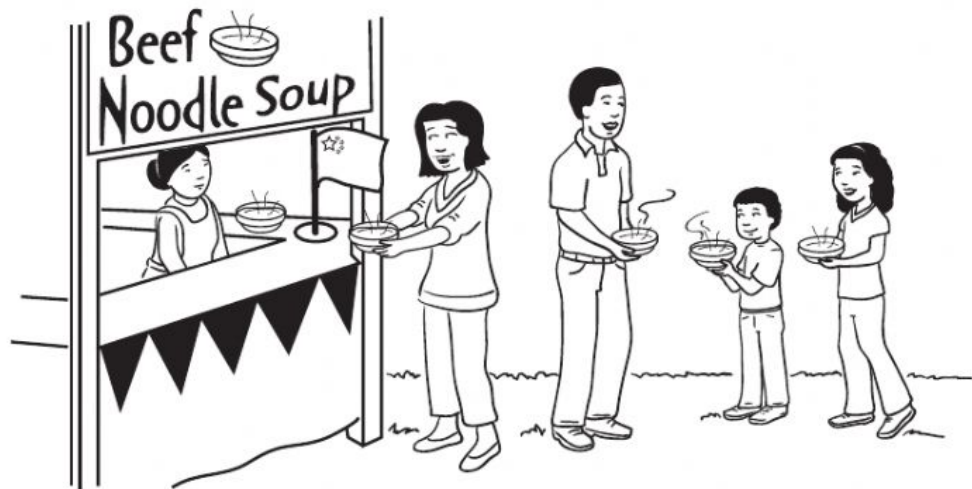
The Food Festival
