It's every boy's dream to drive a real digger and so when I had the chance, I took my two sons to Diggerland, Adventure Park. We had the time of our lives! The diggers are real, heavy machinery, the kind used on construction sites. After following the instructions of the staff, we were allowed to drive these enormous machines. There are height restrictions, which means that little children (under 90 cm tall) are not allowed on the real diggers, but there are plenty of fun activities for them, too. The price covers rides for the whole day, and is good value.
