READING

- A. Education helps an individual to grab a basic understanding of civilization and their role as a civilian. However, as the geographical region differs, the education system in different countries differs too. The Program for International Student Assessment (PISA) routinely releases data which shows Finland's great success in education. Finland is leading the way as a result of the novel and simple changes they've made within a period of 50 years.
- B. Standardized testing is a component of many education systems in the world. Students are tested for subject comprehension. Filling in the blanks and answering multiple choice questions are supposed to be a way to determine mastery or comprehension of a subject. What often happens is that students memorize many things to pass a test and forget most of them after the exam. It means teachers will be teaching with the purpose of students' passing tests. However, Finland has no standardized tests. All children are graded on an individualized grading system set by their teacher.
- C. A lot of the blame goes to the teachers most of the time. But in Finland, the bar is set so high for teachers that there is no need for a grading system for teachers. All teachers must have a master's degree before entering the profession. Teaching programmes are really selective and demanding in the entire country. If a teacher isn't performing well, it is the individual principal's responsibility to do something about it.
- D. Students in Finland have less amount of homework and outside work than any other student in the world. They spend only half an hour a night working on school stuff. Finnish students also don't have private tutors. They are getting everything they need to get done in school without the added pressure. Since they don't have to worry about grades and busy work, they are able to focus on the true task which is learning and growing as a human being.
