

Disabilities

A disability is a mental or physical condition that prevents the body from working as it should. People have different forms of disabilities.

- Physical disabilities include: blindness, deafness, speech defects, paralysis (cripple) etc.
- Emotional disturbances and mental retardation are disabilities.

A disability is not a disease that can be spread to another person.

People who have disabilities want to be treated with respect, care and understanding. They also want to be independent and do as much for themselves as they can. Good citizens see disability as opportunities to learn more about people and their changes.

The following are ways to show respect for individual differences.

- Avoid using put-downs. Don't call people bad names.
- Put yourself in another's person's place and think about how they feel.
- Apologize if you hurt someone's feelings.
- Avoid talking unkindly about someone just because they look or act differently from you.
- Encourage others to try their best, regardless of their abilities.
- Be fair in dealing with others.
- Report acts of bullying or harassment to your teacher or another trusted adult.
- Appreciate what is special about yourself and others.
- Don't miss out on having good friends just because other people are different from you.
