



SIMPLE PAST TENSE



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We use simple past tense for an action that started and also finished in the past, generally with a certain time expression.

* We add to regular verbs **-ed** or **-d** to form the past simple in the affirmative.

e.g.

listen listened
save saved

* For irregular verbs, we have a special form in the past simple in the affirmative. They generally changes completely.

e.g.

go went (not goed)
eat ate (not eaten)

* We use **did not** or **didn't + infinitive without to** for the negative.

e.g.

I **didn't go** on holiday last summer.

* We use **Did + infinitive without to** for questions.

e.g.

Did you visit your grandparents last Sunday?
Yes, I did. (or No, I didn't)

* Adverbs connected with Past Simple:

- yesterday
- the day before yesterday
- one week / two hours ago
- last year / month / Monday
- in 2001 / in 1453
- from 1897 to 1900
- in the 18th / 20th century
- in those days
