Present Simple

(always / usually / every day / sometimes)

I / You / We / They + Verb 1

I always play basketball.

He / She / It + Verb 1 (+s / +es / +ies)

He always plays basketball.

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Past Simple

(yesterday / last week / three days ago)

I played basketball yesterday.

I didn't play basketball yesterday.

Did you play basketball yesterday?

He played basketball last week.

He didn't play basketball last week.

Did he play basketball last week?
