



ING SPELLING RULES

1. Verbs with one syllable, ending in consonant-vowel-consonant	run	double the last consonant and add -ing	running
2. Verbs with two or more syllables, with the stress on the first syllable	LISten	just add -ing	listening
3. Verbs with two or more syllables, with the stress on the second syllable	beGIN	double the last consonant and add -ing	beginning
4. When a verb ends with -ie	die	drop the -ie and add -ing	dying
5. When a verb ends with -e	write	drop the -e and add -ing	writing
6. All other verbs	work	just add -ing	working


