Section 5. Read the passage carefully and answer the questions that follow.

Animals, like human, sleep to renew their energy. But you might be surprised by some of these sleeping habits – and by some of their bedrooms! The koala, for example, is a nocturnal mammal. This means that it sleeps during the day but is active at night. The koala spends its day curled up safely between stout branches of a eucalyptus tree, snoozing peacefully.

Like the koala, most other mammals sleep deeply for hours at a time. Animals that are hunters sleep more than the animals on which they prey. A jaguar may sleep 11 hours a day. A horse sleeps fewer than 3 hours. But horses make up for it by napping while they stand. This way, they are always ready to run if a predator shows up. Prey animals that don't have safe burrows sleep for only very short periods at a time.

Ocean mammals have their own special sleep habits. They live in the water and yet need air to breathe. The elephant seal can actually fall asleep underwater. This is because it's able to do without air for as long as half an hour while it naps.
