Social Studies- Grade: 4- Note Taking Topic: Where is The Bahamas? Part B Lines of Longitude and Latitude

The Bahamas is east of North America.

The closest state to the Bahamas is Florida.

The Bahamas is an archipelago.

An <u>archipelago</u> is a group of islands <u>near</u> each other or close to each other.

Another way we can find The Bahamas on a map is to use lines of latitude and longitude.

Lines of latitude and longitude are imaginary lines drawn around the earth. These lines are numbered in degrees.

Lines of latitude

- imaginary lines parallel to the equator.
- are lines numbered in degrees running north or south of the <u>equator</u>. Examples of Lines of latitude are:
- a. Tropic of Cancer- Latitude- 23 ½ °- passes Long Island and Exuma cays.
- b. Equator- 0°- cuts earth in two halves.



Lines of longitude

- imaginary lines that join the North Pole to the South Pole.
- are lines numbered in degrees running

west or east of the Prime Meridian - 0° which runs through England.

Example of a Line of longitude is:

Prime Meridian 0 -- cuts earth in two halves.

The Bahamas islands are positioned:

- 1. Latitude between latitude 20° North and latitude 28° North
- 2. Longitude between longitudes 72° West and 80° West.
