Joan of Arc was a peasant woman who believed that God had chosen her to lead France to victory in its long-running war with England. She was tried for witchcraft and heresy and burned at the stake in 1431.



Henry IV was the first Lancastrian King. The red rose was the symbol that represented the House of Lancaster.



Edward III (1327-1377) became King of England in 1327. In 1340, he assumed the title of King of France.



Richard II introduced a poll tax in order to collect extra taxes. Because of that, in 1381 the peasants rebelled against him. They entered to London. Richard decided to meet them at Essex and then, at Kent to come into an agreement.



Henry VI (1422-1461 & 1470-1471) was crowned at the age of eight months.



Henry V (1412-1422) fought in the Battle of Agincourt in 1415 conquering partly all France.
