René Gerónimo Favaloro (July 12, 1923 – July 29, 2000) was an Argentine cardiac surgeon (doctor) and educator.

In Argentina the ballpoint pen is known as birome. Argentina's Inventors' Day is celebrated on Bíró's birthday, 29 September.

In 1814, an English engineer called George Stephenson invented a locomotive.

He became famous because he invented the coronary artery bypass surgery using the great saphenous vein.

László Bíró was born on September 29th, 1899, Hungary but died in Argentina. He invented the easy-to-use writing implement known as the biro in Britain and the ballpoint pen in the United States
