**1** Solve these.

- a)  $23 \text{ kg} + 18 \text{ kg} - 6940 \text{ g} = \text{ } \text{g}$
- b)  $9010 \text{ g} - 720 \text{ g} + 5 \text{ kg} = \text{ } \text{kg} \text{ } \text{g}$
- c)  $8 \text{ kg } 5 \text{ g} + 3 \text{ kg } 670 \text{ g} - 2490 \text{ g} = \text{ } \text{g}$
- d)  $825 \text{ g} + 13 \text{ kg } 718 \text{ g} - 4960 \text{ g} = \text{ } \text{kg} \text{ } \text{g}$
- e)  $12 \text{ kg } 218 \text{ g} - 620 \text{ g} + 3 \text{ kg } 410 \text{ g} = \text{ } \text{kg} \text{ } \text{g}$
- f)  $3 \text{ kg } 50 \text{ g} - 265 \text{ g} + 1 \text{ kg } 700 \text{ g} = \text{ } \text{g}$

**2** Subtract 18 kg 565 g from the sum of 72 kg 310 g and 80 g.

| kg | g   |
|----|-----|
| 72 | 310 |
| +  | 80  |
| 72 | 390 |

| kg            | g    |
|---------------|------|
| 61            | 1000 |
| <del>72</del> | 390  |
| - 18          | 565  |
| 53            | 825  |

}  $1000 + 390 - 565 = 825$
