Manuel Zúñiga Camacho

Manuel Alcca Cruz was born on December 25th, 1871, in Puno. When he was 12, he was taken to Moquegua where he attended elementary school. There, thanks to the influence of a priest named Zúñiga, he decided to save the Aymaras from the oppression and abuse of the gamonales. At the age of 24, Manuel decided to change his last name to Zúñiga, and Camacho because of his mother's last name. After serving in the army, Manuel traveled to Chile in 1896 and came into contact with Adventists.



In January 1898 he returned to Peru and settled in the town of Utawilaya, establishing a school that began operating in 1902, in his home.

For years he suffered persecution from the priests, who disapproved his attempt to educate the native of Puno.



In 1908, Zúñiga looked for help of the Adventists, being sent the colporteur Fernando Osorio, and later the pastor Fernando Stahl.

His work, as well as that of his collaborators and successors, made possible the success of what would become the Lake Titicaca Mission.
