national anthem – a song of loyalty to one's country

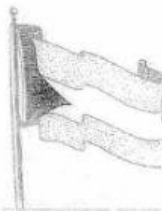
The Bahamas has been an **independent** country since **July 1973**. We rule ourselves. We have our own **national anthem**. "*March on Bahama Land*" it was written by Mr. Timothy Gibson.

The **Coat of Arm** is a composition of things indigenous to these islands. The preliminary design of the coat of arms was prepared by Bahamian artist **Dr. Hervis Bain**.

Dr. Hervis Bain also designed The Bahamas' flag. A black equilateral triangle on the left represents the **unity** and **determination** of the people of the Bahamas. The two aquamarine stripes at the top and bottom of the flag representing **the sea** and one gold stripe representing **the land**
