

READING: King Richard III of England



King Richard II of England lived 500 years ago. According to legend, he used to do terrible things and people hated him. So after he died, they threw his body into the river. But many people didn't believe the legend. They thought the king's body was at the bottom of a staircase in Old Greyfriars Church in Leicester.

Philippa Langley is a member of the Richard II Society, a group of people with a great interest in the King. In 2011, she went to Leicester to look for Old Greyfriars Church, but it wasn't there.

In its place, there was a huge car park. There weren't any signposts, so Langley tried to imagine where the entrance to the church once was. Suddenly, she had a very strange feeling.
