**Anterior View (Right):**

- Box 10: Points to the skull.
- Box 11: Points to the clavicle (collar bone).
- Box 12: Points to the sternum (breastbone).
- Box 13: Points to the xiphoid process (tip of the sternum).
- Box 14: Points to the costal cartilage (rib cage).
- Box 15: Points to the scapula (shoulder blade).
- Box 16: Points to the humerus (upper arm bone).
- Box 17: Points to the radius/ulna (forearm bones).
- Box 18: Points to the carpal bones (wrist).
- Box 19: Points to the metacarpals/phalanges (hand/fingers).
- Box 20: Points to the iliac crest (hip bone).
- Box 21: Points to the femur (thigh bone).
- Box 22: Points to the patella (kneecap).
- Box 23: Points to the tibia/fibula (shin bone).
- Box 24: Points to the calcaneus (heel bone).
- Box 25: Points to the metatarsals/phalanges (foot/toes).
