SIMPLE PRESENT	SIMPLE PAST
S + V + C	S + V_{past} + C
<p>I get up at 6:00. He goes rollerblading.</p> <p>ALWAYS (siempre) USUALLY (usualmente) OFTEN (a menudo) SOMETIMES (aveces) NEVER (nunca)</p> <p>POSITION: <u>Before</u> the verb (antes del verbo)</p> <p>I always get up at 6:00. He sometimes goes rollerblading.</p> <p>IN THE MORNING / AFTERNOON / EVENING/ EVERY DAY EVERY SUMMER / WINTER ... (cada verano/ en invierno ...) ON THE WEEKEND (el fin de semana) ON MONDAY/ FRIDAY... (el lunes/ viernes ...)</p> <p>POSITION: At the end of the sentence (al final de la oración)</p>	<p>I got up at 6:00. He went rollerblading.</p> <p>YESTERDAY (ayer) LAST NIGHT (anoche) LAST WEEK (la semana pasada) LAST FRIDAY/ SATURDAY (El viernes pasado/El Sabado pasado) IN 1998/ IN 2017... TWO DAYS AGO (Hace 2 días)</p> <p>POSITION: At the end of the sentence (al final de la oración)</p>
I get up at 6:00 every day .	I got up at 6:00 yesterday .
