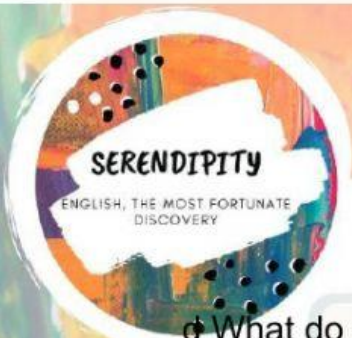

tense	example	use
present simple	I live in the city centre. She doesn't smoke .	things that happen always or usually
present continuous	He's looking for a new job. I'm leaving tomorrow.	things that are happening now or in the near future things that we have arranged for the future
past simple	We saw a good film last night. We didn't do anything yesterday.	finished actions in the past
past continuous	He was working in Paris. What were you doing at 7.00?	actions that were in progress at a past time

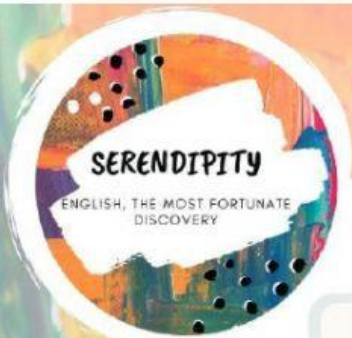
tense	example	use
<i>be going to</i> + infinitive	I'm going to see Tom tonight. Look! It's going to rain .	future plans predictions when we know / can see what's going to happen
<i>will / won't</i> + infinitive	You'll love New York. I'll phone her later. I'll help you. I'll pay you back tomorrow.	predictions instant decisions offers promises
present perfect	I've finished the book. Have you ever been to Iran?	recently finished actions (we don't say when) past experiences

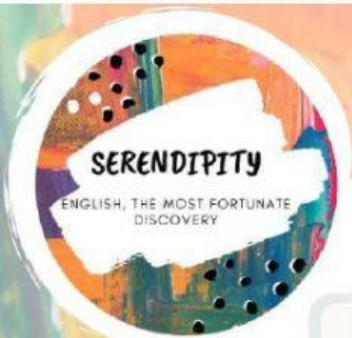
