1. **Extravagance**-excessiveness, a lack of restraint in using money or resources

**Example:** Sasha's mother always buys an **extravagant** cake for her birthday.

2. **Simultaneous**- at the same time

**Example:** The landlord arranged for **simultaneous** fire drills at each of his apartment buildings.

3. **Boisterous**- rough, violent, turbulent, noisy, rowdy, unruly lively

**Example:** **Boisterous** conduct is not permitted in the hallway.

4. **Harass**- repeatedly attack, pester, badger, hound, torment, plague, annoy

**Example:** When Black Beard, Ann Bonny and other pirates began to **harass** American ships, President Jefferson sent the U.S. Navy to protect them.

5. **Pinnacle**- highest point, peak

**Example:** To be Prime Minister of a country could be regarded as the **pinnacle** of success.

6. **Ravenous**- extremely hungry, starving, famished

**Example:** Missing lunch made Corey **ravenous** at dinner time.

7. **Avid**- extremely eager, enthusiastic, passionate, dedicated, keen

**Example:** Howard is an **avid** baseball fan. Each morning, he reads the sports scores even before looking at the front page.
