In today's exam you will show us how much you have studied while learning about some of the greatest singers of all time: Amy Winehouse, John Lennon and Frank Sinatra.

Read the text about Amy Winehouse and answer the questions.

One of my favourite singers is Amy Winehouse. She was a great jazz singer, born on September 14, 1983. She didn't live in Argentina like me. She lived in London. Her father was a taxi driver and her mother was a pharmacist. She only had one brother, Alex.

Amy started playing the guitar at the age of 14 and a year later she started to write music. Amy loved jazz and her favourite musicians were Sarah Vaughan and Dinah Washington. Winehouse won five Grammy Awards connected to her 2006 album *Back to Black*, and earned acclaim for songs like the title track, "Rehab" and "Love Is a Losing Game."

Her debut album, *Frank* (2003), was a mixture of jazz, pop, soul and hip-hop. The album was nominated for the Mercury Music Prize as well as two BRIT awards for Best Female Solo Artist and Best Urban Act.

Some of the biggest names in rock were waiting to collaborate with her. George Michael said: "Amy is the best female vocalist I have ever heard in my entire career, as well as one of the best writers."

Winehouse was constantly the focus of media attention. Reporters followed her everywhere. They were interested in her drug and alcohol addiction.

It is true that she was an addict but she was also very talented and very generous. Throughout her life Winehouse donated her money, music and time to many charities, particularly those concerned with children. She was once named "the most charitable act" by *Pop World*.

After years of battling against drug and alcohol abuse and her self-destructive behaviour, Winehouse died tragically on July 23, 2011, at the age of 27 from accidental alcohol poisoning.

Amy's family misses her a lot and visits the cemetery twice a year. Amy's death represents a great loss to her family and to the entire world as she was an amazing artist.
