

Reading and Vocabulary: Pierre Trudeau

Pierre Elliott Trudeau (Oct. 18, 1919 – Sept. 28, 2000) was a Canadian **politician**. He was the leader of the liberal party, and the 15th Prime Minister of Canada. He was Prime Minister from 1968 to 1979, and again from 1980 to 1984. He won the **elections** of 1968, 1972, 1974, and 1980. He **retired** before the election of 1984.

Some of Trudeau's **accomplishments** in the first four years of his leadership include the Official Languages Act of 1969, and the Multicultural Policy of 1971. These meant that Canada's government **recognized** French and English as equal and official languages in the government, but also that Canada had many cultures.

In foreign affairs, Trudeau ensured Canada remained a strong member in the North American Treaty Organization [NATO]. In October of 1970 Pierre Trudeau formed **diplomatic relations** with the

One of Trudeau's greatest **accomplishment** is the 1982 **Constitution** Act. Two major parts of this act include Canada's Charter of Rights and Freedoms and The Rights of Aboriginal Peoples of Canada. This act gave Canada the right to create and **amend** its own constitution without needing approval from Britain.
