3.	People eat this sweet rice with red paste that is made from red chilli peppers.	
4.	In Japan, for example, people usually eat rice, soup and fish for breakfast.	
5.	Malaysians eat rice for breakfast too, but their breakfast rice is cooked in coconut milk with sugar.	
6.	However, in most Central American and South American countries rice is not eaten for breakfast.	
7.	From these breakfast items, it is clear that breakfast varies greatly around the world.
