Here are 7 sentences about breakfast foods internationally. They make a paragraph when they are in the correct order. They are in the wrong order here.

Find the topic sentence. Then, follow the **linking words** (adverbs/adverbial phrases) to decide on the correct order. When you have decided, write the numbers 1 – 7 in the boxes to show the order.

1. <b>Instead</b> , for them breakfast is usually eggs with toast and coffee.	
2. Breakfast foods are different in countries around the world.	
3. People eat <b>this sweet rice</b> with red paste that is made from red chilli peppers.	
4. In Japan, <b>for example</b> , people usually eat rice, soup and fish for breakfast.	
5. Malaysians eat rice for breakfast <b>too, but</b> their breakfast rice is cooked in coconut milk with sugar.	
6. <b>However</b> , in most Central American and South American countries rice is not eaten for breakfast.	
7. <b>From these breakfast items</b> , it is clear that breakfast varies greatly around the world.
