USEFUL WORDS

SOCIETY: a population of humans with patterns of relationships between individuals that share a distinctive culture and/or institutions.

ANTISOCIAL: against society

SOCIAL CLASS: the hierarchical distinctions between individuals or groups in societies or cultures.

MULTICULTURAL SOCIETY: society in which there is a cultural diversity.

CITIZENSHIP: membership in a political community that carries with it rights to political participation.

HUMAN RIGHTS: The Rights Of Individuals to liberty, justice.

MINORITY: a sociological group that does not constitute a politically dominant voting majority of the total population of a given society.

FAMILY: A primary social group consisting of parents and their offspring

RACE: A group of people of common ancestry, distinguished from others by physical characteristics

WELFARE: Health, happiness, prosperity, and well-being in general

A GENDER ROLE: set of perceived behavioral norms associated with males or females, in a given social

IMMIGRATION: The movement of non-native people into a country in order to settle there

HEALTH CARE embraces all the goods and services designed to promote health

ISSUE	to make or see a difference on the basis of (class, race, religion, gender) and then, showing unfair treatment because of it
RACISM	living in a community rather than in isolation (alone)
BULLY	a point or matter which is of special importance
DISCRIMINATE	the use of violence and threats to intimidate especially for political reasons
CYBER BULLYING	a belief that one's race is superior (better) and therefore, has a right to rule the other
PREJUDICE	a conflict carried on by force of arms between nations or between parties within a nation;
TERRORISM	state of having little or no money
WAR	one who targets a peer using interactive technologies
POVERTY	a quarrelsome person who habitually badgers and intimidates smaller or weaker people
SOCIAL	an unfavorable opinion or feeling formed beforehand or without knowledge
