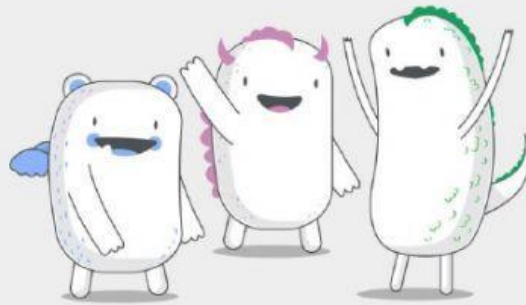


## THERE IS

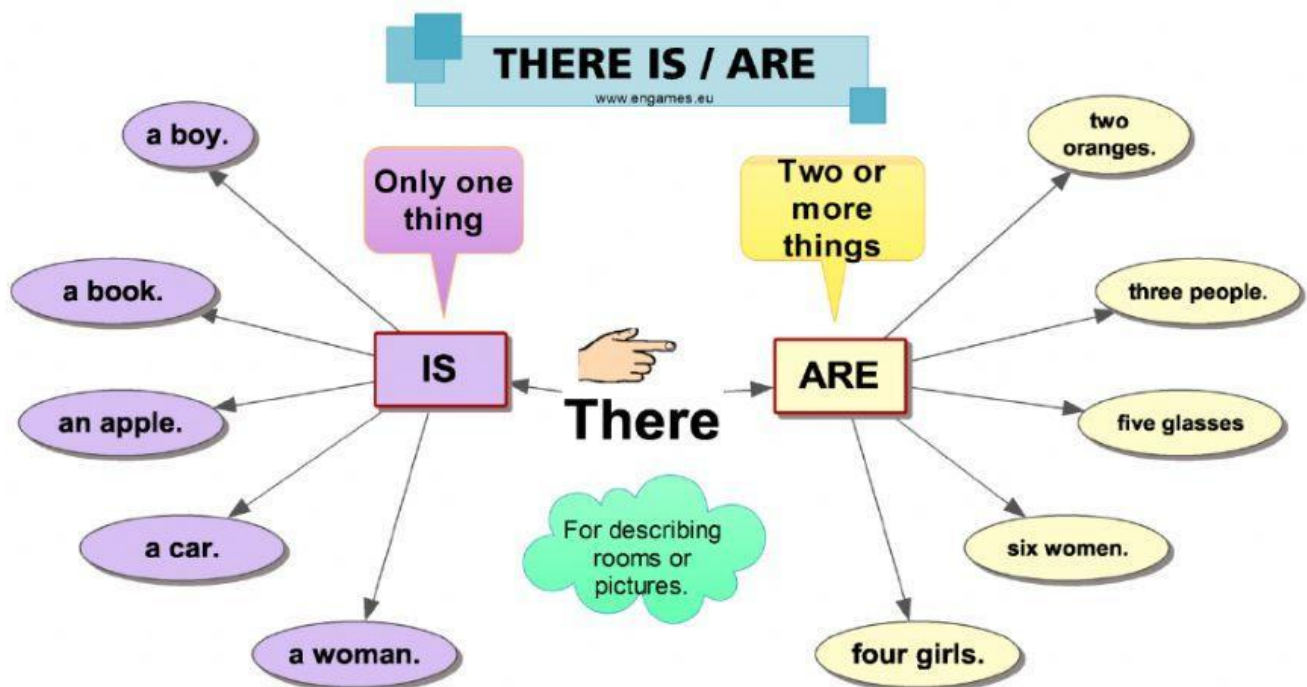


## THERE ARE



We use there is when the noun is singular "There is a cat".

We use there are when the noun is plural "There are two cats".



\*The contraction of **there is** is **there's**.

You **cannot** contract **there are**.
