Vietnamese people often enjoy sharing a meal with the whole family. The meal is often shared with loved ones over a lot of (1)\_\_\_\_\_. They eat from bowls and use chopsticks and spoons but chopsticks still remain as the most popular means of eating. Learn how to use chopsticks and how to put them (2)\_\_\_\_\_ when not using. For instance, you should place them neatly on the table or on the bowl when breaking to drink or speak. When finished with a meal, rest your chopsticks on your rice bowl. Sticking the chopsticks straight up from a bowl of rice is a (3)\_\_\_\_\_ because it indicates funeral incense. It is also best to keep in mind that (4)\_\_\_\_\_ the chopsticks on the side of a bowl is considered rude.

You should also wait to be seated in the dining table and ask the elders to eat first (5)\_\_\_\_\_ this is a mark of honor to them.
