Diana, Princess of Wales (1961 – 1997), born Diana Frances Spencer, was a member of the British royal family. She was the first wife of Charles, Prince of Wales—the heir apparent to the British throne—and mother of Prince William and Prince Harry. Diana's activism and glamour made her an international icon and earned her enduring popularity as well as unprecedented public scrutiny.

Diana was born into the British nobility and grew up close to the royal family on their Sandringham estate. In 1981, while working as a nursery teacher's assistant, she became engaged to Prince Charles, the eldest son of Queen Elizabeth II. Their wedding took place at St Paul's Cathedral in 1981 and made her Princess of Wales, a role in which she was enthusiastically received by the public. The couple had two sons, William and Harry. Diana's marriage to Charles, however, suffered due to their incompatibility and extramarital affairs. They separated in 1992 and the marriage ended in divorce in 1996.

The Princess was initially noted for her shyness, but her charisma and friendliness endeared her to the public and helped her reputation survive the acrimonious collapse of her marriage. Considered to be very photogenic, she was a leader of fashion in the 1980s and 1990s. Diana's death in a car crash in Paris led to extensive public mourning and global media attention. Her legacy has had a deep impact on the royal family and British society.

Carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>) is an acidic colorless gas with a density of 53% higher than that of dry air. It occurs naturally in Earth's atmosphere as a trace gas and its molecules consist of a carbon atom covalently double bonded to two oxygen atoms. Natural sources for carbon dioxide include volcanoes, hot springs and geysers, and **it** is freed from carbonate rocks by dissolution in water and acids. Because carbon dioxide is soluble in water, it occurs naturally in groundwater, rivers and lakes, ice caps, glaciers and seawater. It is also present in deposits of petroleum and natural gas.

As the source of available carbon in the carbon cycle, atmospheric carbon dioxide is the primary carbon source for life on Earth. It's regarded as a very versatile industrial material, used, for example, as an inert gas in welding and fire extinguishers, as a pressurizing gas in air guns and oil recovery... It is also added to drinking water and carbonated beverages including beer and sparkling wine to add effervescence. The frozen form, dry ice, is used as a refrigerant.

Carbon dioxide is the most **significant** long-lived greenhouse gas in Earth's atmosphere. Since the Industrial Revolution anthropogenic emissions – primarily from use of fossil fuels and deforestation – have rapidly increased its concentration in the atmosphere, leading to global warming. Carbon dioxide also causes ocean acidification because it dissolves in water to form carbonic acid.
