

SIMPLE PRESENT TENSE

The **simple present tense** is used to describe habits, unchanging situations, general truths, and fixed arrangements.

Forms

+ S + V(s/es) + O.

- S + don/t/doesn't + V (base form) + O.

? Do/does + S + V(base form) + O ?

Affirmative (+)	Negative (-)	Interrogative (?)
• I run fast.	I don't run fast.	Do I run fast?
• You run fast.	You don't run fast.	Do you run fast?
• He runs fast.	He doesn't run fast.	Does he run fast?
• She runs fast.	She doesn't run fast.	Does she run fast?
• It runs fast.	It doesn't run fast.	Does it run fast?
• They run fast.	They don't run fast.	Do they run fast?
• We run fast.	We don't run fast.	Do we run fast?
