Both <u>used to</u> and <u>would</u> are used to express <u>past habits</u> which are no longer true.

I USED TO USE MEMES.

Do not confuse <u>would</u> when it is a conditional tense. You will distinguish whether it is <u>conditional</u> or a <u>past habit</u> thanks to the context.

USED TO	WOULD
Affirmative: He <u>used to</u> ride his horse	Affirmative: Last year he would ride his horse
Negative: He ride is horse	Negative: Last year heride his

	However, both negative and interrogative
	forms are <u>not</u> very common
Used to talk about past habits, states and past opinions.	Used to talk about past habits, only for repeated actions. So, it is NOT used for states or opinion verbs
I used to go swimming (habit)	or opinion verbs
As a child, I didn't like eating meat	I would go swimming (repeatedly)
(state)	As a child, I would ride a bike every day
When I was younger, I used to believe I was	(repeatedly)
always right (opinion)	As a child, I wouldn't like eating meat (It is not a
	repeated action)

Rephrasing. Rephrasing means we have different ways to express the same ideas.

Example: When I was a kid, I used to go to the park.

- = When I was a kid, I would go to the park.
- = When I was a kid, I usually went to the park

(we can use frequency adverbs: normally, often, sometimes, every day, once a week,...)
