

## MAKING SPECULATIONS IN THE PAST ...

As a detective, you need to find clues and guess what happened on a crime scene.

You need to make "SPECULATIONS ON PAST EVENTS", that's what investigating is all about!

First, listen to the following video to better understand how it works:

Then look at the clues found on the crime scene and **make deductions about what must, might or can't have happened.** (Fill in the blanks using the verb within brackets)

Clue N°1:



A window is broken so ...

The murderer \_\_\_\_\_ into the  
house through the window. (break)

Clue N°2:



A cigarette end was found in the garden near the broken window so ...

The murderer \_\_\_\_\_ in the garden for a while (wait)

Clue N°3



The door was found locked so ...

The murderer \_\_\_\_\_ the house through the door. (enter)

Clue N°4:



The living room was in a mess so ...

The murderer and the victim (fight).

Clue N°5:



The safe was open so ...

The murderer \_\_\_\_\_ the victim to steal his money. (kill)

Clue N°6:



A bloody knife was found near the victim so ...

The murderer \_\_\_\_\_ the victim  
with this knife. It must be the murder weapon.  
(stab)
