## SCOTTISH GEOGRAPHY (Levels 5-6)

### MAP OF SCOTLAND

These are the main cities in Scotland with a brief description. Read the description and situate them on the map.

- a.** Edinburgh is the capital of Scotland but it's the second largest city (after Glasgow). It's in the south of Scotland on the coast.
- b.** Aberdeen is the third largest city in Scotland and is situated on the north coast. It's also known as the Granite City because many buildings here are made with this rock.
- c.** Glasgow is the largest city in Scotland. It's situated on the river Clyde and is quite close to Edinburgh. The people from Glasgow are known as Glaswegians.
- d.** Inverness (which in Scottish Gaelic means "mouth of the river Ness") is the capital of the Highlands region in Scotland and is near Loch Ness.
- e.** Perth is a city in Central Scotland which lies on Scotland's longest river, the Tay. It used to be the capital of Scotland in the ninth century.
- f.** Dundee is Scotland's fourth largest city, situated in the centre of Scotland but on the coast. Sir William Wallace went to school here.
