Weblish is a kind of ‘slang’— idiomatic English which often breaks the rules of correct English. For example, capital letters are not used. Here is a glossary of some of the key expressions and symbols used in chat rooms.

u — you

c — see

2 — to

r — are

b — be

4 — for

nite — night

yup — yes

thanx — thanks

cos — because

dumbo — stupid

best — best wishes

wanna — do you want to

just thought — I just thought

cheer him — it’ll cheer him up

u bet — you bet (this means a strong ‘Yes!’)
