

Prepositional Phrases

A prepositional phrase **begins with a preposition** (words like *in, on, under, around, across, over, from, up, with, about, to*) and **ends with the first noun** (person, place, or thing).

For example: The candy is on the table. *on* is the preposition, *table* is the first noun
on the table is the prepositional phrase

Example: They want to meet at his house. *at* is the preposition, *house* is the first noun
at his house is the prepositional phrase
