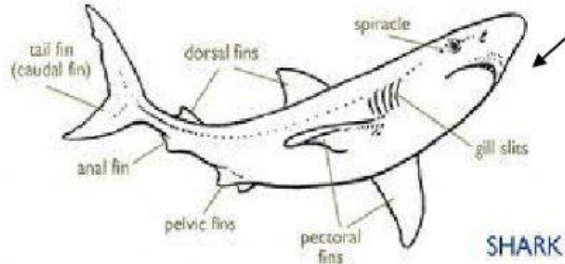


The hammerhead is a very aggressive shark. They are well known for their hunting and unique head shape.

What They Eat

While the diet of a shark varies from type to type, one thing that is true for all sharks, is that they are all **carnivorous**, meaning that they eat meat.

Some sharks, such as the tiger shark, the great white, and the mako shark prefer to feast on larger fish, squid, and other ocean animals. The great whites especially love to feast on sea lions.

Other sharks, such as the massive whale shark, are what we call filter feeders. They swim with their mouths open and feed on plankton and other small animals in the water.
