General Elections in The Bahamas are usually held every five years. Before an election can be held, the Prime Minister must set a date. Eligible voters must then be registered in their various constituencies. Next, candidates wishing to contest the elections have to be nominated by at least five people. The various political parties also hold rallies at this time. On election day voters cast ballots for the candidate of their choice. Later that day the votes are tallied and, finally, the election results are broadcast.
