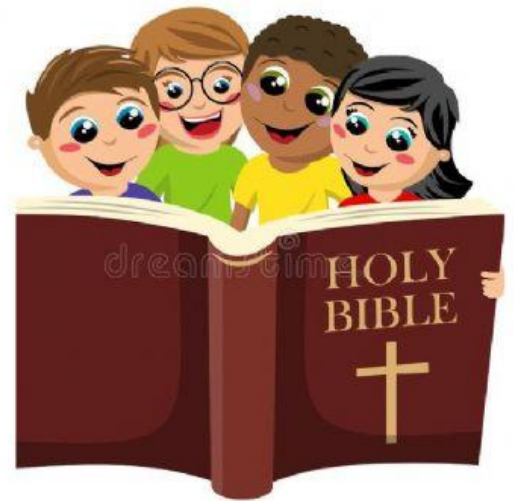
The Nature of God

- The Bible is divided into two main parts – the Old Testament and the New Testament.
- The New Testament is a record of Jesus' life and teachings. It is a collection of twenty-seven books written by a number of authors.



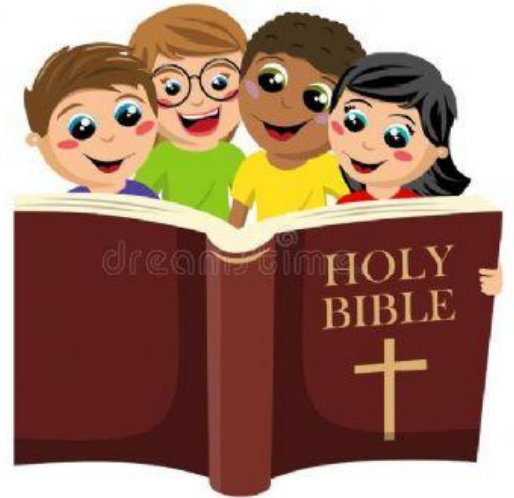
The Four Gospels

- The first four books of the New Testament (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John) are called the Gospels. The word 'gospel' means "good news."
- The gospel writers were so excited about their "good news" that they wanted to share it with others.



The Four Gospels

- They wanted people to know that Jesus was the Messiah. They also wanted to preserve the message of Jesus for future generations.



The Four Gospels

- The four gospels teach about the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. The divine nature of Jesus is revealed in the gospels (Christ, Son of God, Lord, Savior etc.).
