

Esperanza Base

Esperanza Base is Argentinian and it's in Antarctica. It's very sunny (70°C) and it's very cold in winter (-10°C). There are houses for about 100 people there. There are ten families with children, there's a school and there are two teachers. There's also a bank and a hospital. There are a few cars, but there's only one road - it's 1.5 km long!



VERY HOT!

Ghadames

Ghadames is a beautiful old city in Libya. There are lots of old houses, shops and cafés - so what's different? Ghadames is in the Sahara. It's very hot in the day (40°C) and it's very hot at night (25°C). The houses are very thick and they're always cool. In the old town there are streets for men and children and there are different streets (on the roofs of the houses) for women. Now there are some new houses and flats, but in summer lots of people go to live in the old houses because they aren't hot.


