




UNIT 5: COMPARATIVE ADJECTIVES

RULES: SHORT ADJECTIVES

1) Complete the examples according to the theory.

- LOTS OF COMPARATIVE ADJECTIVES END IN **-ER**.
- COOL → COOL - WARM → WARM - SHORT → SHORT
- ADJECTIVES ENDING IN **-Y**. WE CHANGE **-Y** AND ADD **-IER**.
- DRY → DR - FRIENDLY → FRIENDL - EASY → EAS
- ADJECTIVES ENDING IN **VOWEL + CONSONANT**. WE DOUBLE
THE LAST CONSONANT AND ADD **-ER**.
- WET → WET - BIG → BIG - HOT → HOT
