

Possessive Nouns

Possessive Nouns show possession or ownership

The **apostrophe (')** is used when writing possessive nouns. However, when doing so, the **following rules** must be followed:

1. To show possession of a **singular noun**, write the noun which indicates the owner, then add **('s)**. E.g. the **man's** car.
2. If the **plural noun does not** end with **(s)**, add **('s)** as in the case of singular nouns.
3. If **plural nouns end with (s)**, write the apostrophe **after the (s')**

E.g. the **girls'** bathroom
