



CAUSATIVES

I. The Active Pattern

This pattern explains that one person causes another person to do something.

-The active pattern with HAVE (We engage or employ somebody to do smth for us)

Have+ Somebody+ Do(V1) +Something

- I employed a porter to carry my suitcase.
- I had a porter carry my suitcase.
- She will hire a painter to paint the house.
- She will have a painter paint her house.

-The active pattern with GET (We persuade/ convince someone to do something)

Get+ Somebody+To + Do(V1)+ Something

- *He persuaded his son to do the laundry.
- * He got his son to do the laundry.
- *She convinced the man to work at lunch time.
- *She got the man to work at lunch time.

-The active pattern with MAKE(We force somebody to do something)

Make+ Somebody+ Do(V1)+ Something

- *The teacher made us do the homework again.(She forced us to do it)
- *He can't force me work if I don't want to.
- *He can't make me work if I don't want to.

-The active pattern with LET(We allow somebody to do something)

Let+ Somebody+Do(V1)+Something

- *My mother doesn't allow me to go out at night.
- * My mother doesn't let me go out at night.

II .The Passive Pattern

Causative construction is used when we arrange with a person to do something for us. We don't do the action ourselves. " I had my shoes polished" means that someone polished my shoes, or I employed someone to polish my shoes. We may not know who does the action.

We use HAVE when we engage or employ someone to something, and we use GET when we persuade/convince someone to do something.

GET is used in place of HAVE in the causative to say that something is urgent/important. GET is stronger than HAVE.

If we want to use MAKE in the passive structure, we must add to.

Active: She made me clean my room.

Passive: I was made to clean my room.

We CANNOT use LET in the passive. Instead, we have to use ALLOWED TO V1

Active: The doctor didn't let me go to school.

Passive: I wasn't allowed to go to school.

A. have get something done

subject + have/get + direct object + verb (3)
