

Identifying and writing four kinds of sentences

◆ There are four kinds of sentences. each one does something different.

- *A declarative sentence tells something. It is a statement and ends with a period.
- *An interrogative sentence asks something. It is a question and ends with a question mark.
- *An imperative sentence tells someone to do something. It is a command and ends with a period.
- *An exclamatory sentence shows strong feeling. It is an exclamation and ends with an exclamation mark.
